## Introduction:

Karimpur is geographically located as the borderline between Nadia and Murshidabad district of West Bengal and it is also very near to our neighboring country Bangladesh. So the place has its own socio-political and cultural importance from the very beginning. On 4<sup>th</sup> August, 1968 as a 'Home of Higher Education' Karimpur Pannadevi College was established to cater higher education to the people of Karimpur and its vast locality, particularly for the students belonging to the poor and middle class families who cannot afford to go far off places for meeting the demand of higher education. The College has now a three-storied building measuring about 40,000 sq.ft., having a campus of about 7 acres. Presently the College offers education to around 4,000 students of Arts, Science and Commerce streams. Students come from different corners of the locality. Now the college offers total twenty three programmes among which eleven courses for Honours Graduate Degrees – seven in Arts, three in Science and one in Commerce – and three courses for General Graduate Degree of the Kalyani University. The total roll strength of students during this academic year including 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year is 3884.

This year the college has celebrated its 50<sup>th</sup> foundation Day and I on behalf of the college presenting the Annual Report of the different Academic and Administrative attainments of the Institution. With a view to provide best education by using our existing resource optimally to the rural stakeholders the college has taken several remarkable initiatives which are also incorporated in this report.

## 7. Celebration:

### College Foundation Day:

The 50<sup>th</sup> Foundation Day was celebrated on 4<sup>th</sup> August (Friday), 2017 at the College Auditorium at 11:30 a.m. The Chief Guest was Sri Chiru Ranjan Mondal, Former GB president of this college. The program started with inaugural songs by students. Words of welcome were delivered by Honourable Teacher-in-Charge, Sri Kaustav Bhattacharyya. All the teachers, students, ex-students, staff-members were present in the programme. The cultural programme was held in the afternoon session presented by our students.

### 71<sup>st</sup> Independence Day:

The 71<sup>st</sup> Independence Day was celebrated on 15<sup>th</sup> August, 2017 (Tuesday) on the college premises. The national flag was hoisted by our Teacher-in Charge, Sri Kaustav Bhattacharyya and also delivered an inspiring speech on this occasion. It was followed by some cultural programme presented by NSS.

### NSS Day:

On 24<sup>th</sup> September 2017 annual NSS day was celebrated by the NSS Volunteers at the college premises. The objective and the mission of NSS were discussed by the coordinator before the audience.

### 155<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda and National Youth Day:

Hence our college was remain Closed in 12<sup>th</sup> January on account of Swami Vivekananda's 155<sup>th</sup> birth anniversary, the National Youth Day was observed on 15 January, 2018 (Monday). A meeting was held at the college Smart Hall at 2.30 p.m. The programme was continued with the speeches of selected the students of our College and 3 teachers.

### Saraswati Puja:

Saraswati Puja was celebrated on 22 January, 2018 (Monday) with great devotion and *Prasad* was distributed by students. An exhibition was also arranged by them.

### 69<sup>th</sup> Republic Day:

69 Republic Day was celebrated on 26 January, 2018 (Friday) at 8:30 a.m. in the morning, in front of entrance of the College. The programme was started by hoisted our Nation Flag by honourable President of the GB Smt. Mahua Moitra, MLA, Karimpur Constituent Assembly, No.77), and continued by National Anthem, Speeches.

International Mother Language Day: Like the previous Year this year also the college has organised a small but very impact full programme on 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2018 to celebrate the International Mother language Day or the "*Antarjatic Matri Bhasha Dibas*" In college Smart Room at 2.30 p.m. Teachers of History, English and Political Science have discussed the history and significance of that very day.

Rabindra Jayanti: 158<sup>th</sup> Birth Day anniversary on 9<sup>th</sup> May (Wednesday) also celebrated by our students. An inaugural song presented by students and the Universal values and the idea

of social harmony propagated by the Tagore was beautifully delivered by or college teacher-in-Charge, Sri Kaustav Bahttacharyya.

World Environment Day: on 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2018 to create awareness among the students and locality the College NSS have celebrated the World Environment Day with great prestige. A rally was organised by them and after that a lecture was delivered by the Teacher-in-Charge on “Environment: A Great Threat to Human Civilization.”

8. **IQAC Initiatives:** The College IQAC was formed under the new guideline of UGC and NACC on 02/11/2017. After its functional formation the cell has taken several quality initiatives to improve the teaching –learning environment of the institution and completing the 1<sup>st</sup> cycle of NAAC. Some of the major initiative are discussed bellow:
  - A. **MoU with Other Institution:** Signed MoU with Ramakrishna Mission Sikshan Mandira, Belur Math, Howrah ( Autonomus M.Ed College and Research Centre under Calcutta University , West Bengal. It will help us to exchange different kind of academic initiative, E-resources, virtual classes, resource persons and to organize workshop, seminar on Value education.
  - B. **Total Online and E- counseling in Admission Process:** Introduce Total online and E-counseling admission process in 1<sup>st</sup> Semester admission. Probably the first college which has taken decision and execute the total online and e-counseling for 1<sup>st</sup> semester admission successfully.
  - C. **Alumni Registration:** Registration of Alumni Association is done successfully under the West Bengal Society Registration Act. This formal affiliation will open the new avenue for our alumni to do something extended activities for our stakeholders. One our alumni Dr. Bimalendu Biswas, Controller of Examination, University of Kalyani has given his kind consent to be the honourable president of this Alumni Association.
  - D. **Installation of the Solar Panel:** IQAC thinks that as there is a growing consensus on using renewable energy and reduce the cost of unrenewable traditional source of power. So as per NAAC or SSR guide line it has been found in different criteria that if institution promote to use or practically source of renewable energy or natural-eco-friendly technology them it will increase credit marks and it seems to be a remarkable best practice. In this regard IQAC suggests to install a Solar Panel mechanism for supplying the total electric power of the institution in collaboration with WBSEDCL instead of consuming the existing system of electric source. GB has considered the matter very seriously and the process for its installation is under process.
  - E. **Professional Development of Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff:** It has been found that due some generation gap some of our teaching and non-teaching staff are not very much comfort in using the modern ICT. To cover the gap and enhanced their skill a workshop was arranged successfully on 29<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> May and 1<sup>st</sup> June, 2018 at college smart class room. The title of the programme was “Hands on Basic Computer Workshop”.



- F. **Orientation Programme on CBCS for Teaching Faculty:** The University of Kalyani has directed the college to implement the new CBCS and Semester system from the 2018-2019 academic year. But our teaching faculty hardly has any idea to execute it successfully. To aware them properly the IQAC has organised an one day orientation programme on “CBCS and Semester System” on 29/11/2017.
- G. **Orientation Programme on CBCS and Semester system for neighboring H.S. School Student:** The IQAC think that coming batch of 1<sup>st</sup> semester have no idea about newly introduced CBCS and Semester System. To provide them handful of information and to guide them properly in near future first time the college has organised an one day orientation programme on “CBCS and Semester programme” for our neighboring School student who are supposed to be our next stakeholders. The programme was organised on 19/12/2017 and 218 students from different schools have participated in that programme.
- H. **Programme on Yoga and Meditation:** To familiar our students with the Indian cultural heritage of Yoga and Meditation and how to get relief from the huge pressure of daily life by practicing the Yoga an workshop was organised by IQAC at the smart class room on 09/01/2018. Smt. Smriti Halder was the resource person. Near about 70 students of different departments was present in the workshop.
9. **Organised International seminar on “Women, Society and Politics: A Study on India and Bangladesh**

Our college has successfully arranged the International seminar on Women, Society and Politics: A Study on India and Bangladesh on 24<sup>th</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> April, 2018 with the financial support from Moulana Abul Kalam Azad Institute of Asian Studies (MAKAIAS) in association with Jahangirnagar University, Bangladesh. To make this event academically more vibrant honourable resource persons from different universities and colleges adorned the seminar. The most remarkable things is that near about 70 teachers and research scholars have presented their profound and thought provoking research papers in this two days’ seminar on the different issues related to Women, Society and Politics. The Paper presenters came from different colleges which are affiliated to esteem Universities like Vidyasagar University, Gour Banga University, Calcutta University, Burdwan University, Kalyani University, and Jawaharlal Nehru University etc. A research scholar from JNU presented a paper on Women Trafficking. 50 students including 7 students from the Department of Government and Politics, Jahangirnagar University, Bangladesh have actively participated in this International event. This student Exchange Programme has been applauded by almost all the dignitaries and this has made an appropriate platform for us to carry out a pioneering role to make this programme more effective in future. The students of Bangladesh have not only presented their research paper, but also shared their valuable experiences of their country regarding women society and politics during the interaction session.
